9:15AM **Evolving Health Issues**

Daniel Hendrickson, DVM, Four Star Veterinary Service

Reputable swine veterinarian, Dr. Daniel Hendrickson, will discuss the latest in swine health and answer your questions in an open forum. Topics to include common issues with preventative and recovery options, what you should know about health and vaccination protocols, and what we are experiencing with the latest PEDv issues. Dr. Hendrickson will tackle these problems from both breeder and exhibitor perspectives.

11:00AM **How A Foreign Animal Disease Will Affect Us All**

If a foreign animal disease (FAD) is confirmed in the United States, movement restrictions for susceptible livestock will be put into place by Regulatory Officials. Officials will set up regulatory Control Areas (areas where premises are quarantined and movement is restricted) around infected premises and movement of livestock will only be allowed by permits. Dr. Carrie Koonce and Holli Tietjen-Hale with Texas Animal Health Commission will cover all aspects of FAD response and recovery stages, detailing topics such as biosecurity, movement restrictions, and permitting so that you as a swine producer can prepare for such an incident and be ready.

TPPA executive and various directors will provide an overview of current programming and present association updates and important news. There will also be a presentation on the proposed U.S. Swine Health Improvement Plan. SHIP, modeled after the National Poultry Improvement Plan, is a two-year pilot project that could be transitioned into a more formal platform for safeguarding, certifying, and bettering the health of US swine and longterm competitiveness of the US pork industry.
