



AFTER-THE-SHOW

check list

PROTECT YOUR PIGS, BARN, AND THE PORK INDUSTRY.

DEEP CLEAN & DISINFECT:

BARN & TRAILER

- Remove all bedding and manure.
- Wash and disinfect pens, gates, floors, and walkways.
- Allow barns to fully dry before reuse.

EQUIPMENT TO CLEAN & DISINFECT

- Feeders & waters
- All buckets
- Panels
- Brushes/Whips
- Show boxes (and equipment inside)
- And...anything you utilized at the show!

CLEANING TIPS

Wash your equipment/rooms with the hottest water possible.

- Detergents, similar to those used for dish washing, may make cleaning much easier.

TIPS ON USING DISINFECTANT

- First and foremost, follow label directions. Directions may include how long a disinfectant needs to be on a surface and rinsing procedures.
- Using a pump sprayer helps distribute evenly.
- Use disinfectants only after cleaning.

AFTER EVERYTHING IS CLEAN...:

EXPOSURE TO PEOPLE & TRAFFIC

- Limit visitors to only those who have a reason to be at your farm and only allow visitors when you are present.
- Visitors need to wear clean boots or plastic boot covers and clean clothing.
- Control of wildlife, birds and other pests.

KEEP THE AREA CLEAN

- Keep the area around your barn free of weeds, debris or feed to make the area less desirable for unwanted pests.
- Utilize fencing, bird netting or other materials to keep pests out of the barn or away from the building. Use rodent baits according to label directions and keep baits out of reach of your pigs.

BUILD YOUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Ask your ag teacher, extension agent, veterinarians, or breeders to help you create a plan to prevent disease entering your farm.

- Evaluate farm health history and identify potential concerns.
- Purchase necessary items to carry out biosecurity plan moving forward. Prepare for your new set of pigs by keeping your barn and equipment clean.
